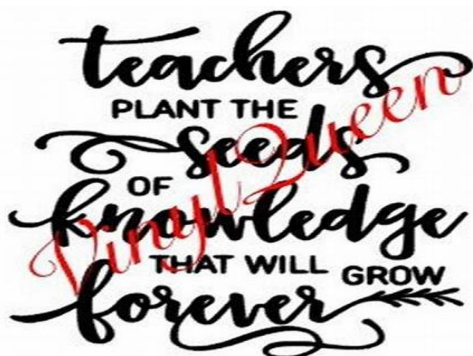

Congratulations to everyone in Yr8 for getting perfect 10 out of 10 scores on their pop quiz.





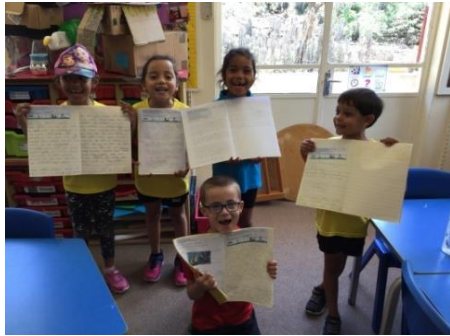
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Year 1 and 2
