PTA

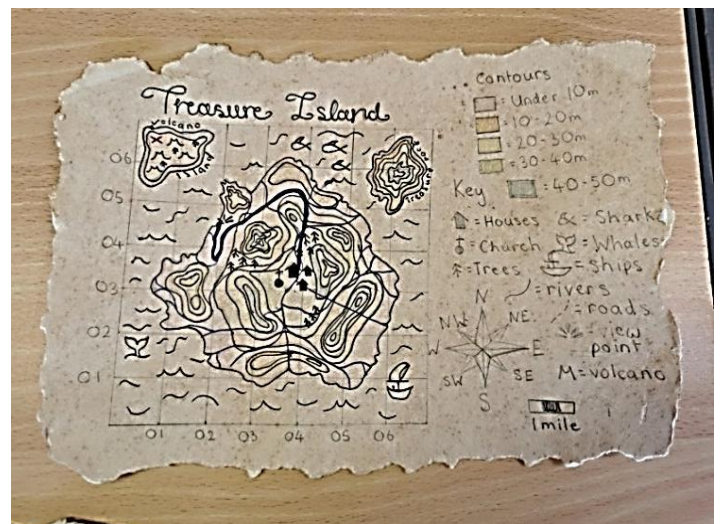
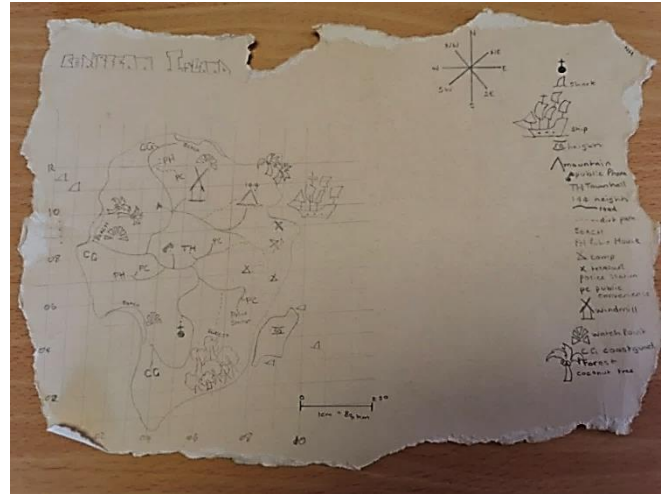

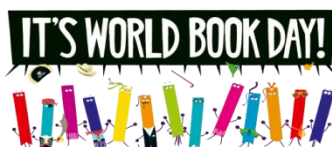

Encompass who made us feel very welcome. Well done to the children of Year 5/6, who were perfectly behaved and asked fantastic questions all morning! Mr Britten



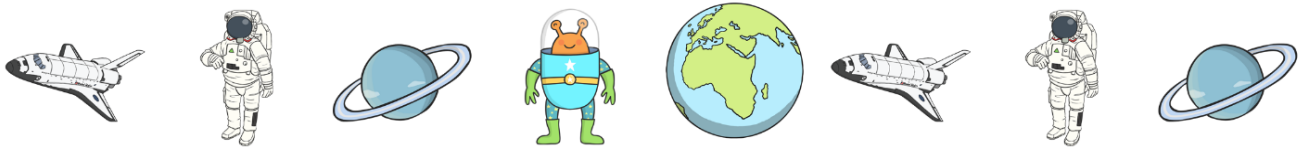
