With my years of teaching experience I only needed to do a term of induction to secure my teaching status. From there it was onwards In my role as Deputy Director in and upwards. Learning I became a mentor for student teachers and led teaching and learning to teachers with varying degrees of experience across all sectors in the school. I developed a love of teaching pedagogy and my ideas have been shared with many colleagues across Swindon schools. In 2017 I was awarded an excellence in teaching award by Swindon Borough Council, this was followed by me gaining Lead practitioner status in 2018 and becoming a member of the newly formed Chartered College of Teaching.

Having been back here at TBS for almost 10 months I bring to the school a wealth of skills and experience. Teaching has always been a passion of mine and I

have a real desire to see every student here at TBS thrive and be the best they can be.

I would like to thank all those who have supported me, both past and present in my journey to date and to those who will be there as I embark on the new road ahead. I will end here with my favourite quote by Will Durant:
