Following on from this, the Reception children did some independent writing about their trip. They used their phonics really well to help them write some of the words.



We have covered so much in maths—counting in 1's and 10's to 100, counting in 2's, adding 1, 2 or 3 to another number, doubles to double 5, pattern work, finding 1 more or 1 less and subtracting too! We also had fun going shopping with the money. We are doing so well and at times exceeded our expectations...we were super proud of ourselves.
