It's official! Two Boats School is fully compliant with the COBIS compliance standards and is recommended for COBIS (compliance) status.

As Head of the school it is my absolute privilege to lead and work with such an amazing team. It has been a long and hard road but this result has made it all so worthwhile. The full report is confidential to the Head and the Governing Board and contains some next steps which will inform the new development plan for the school. However below is the overall observation of the report:

Two Boats School is a happy school, with a welcoming and friendly atmosphere. Students are well behaved; keen to learn and achieve. Staff are committed to the pastoral wellbeing of their students, as well as their academic success. There is a friendly and family like atmosphere in the school.
