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Year 3 and 4 Visit

There has been a lot of exciting learning happening in Year 3 and 4! In particular, we would like to share some of the exciting things we have been doing in science!

Last term, we learned about plants. We conducted experiments on plants to learn about what they need to grow and what the function of leaves, stems, roots and flowers is.







To consolidate our learning about plants, we went on a field trip to Green Mountain, where we participated in an engaging educational session led by Lydia, Jolene and Diego from the Conservation Plant Team.

We learned about the difference between endemic, native and invasive plant species on Ascension Island.

The conservation team tested our knowledge on plants and the parts of flowers with a quiz and a chance to dissect and examine the parts of Ascension Lilies!





We also examined some of the canna lilies that grow near the Red Lion and learned about how they spread their seeds.







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We then walked from the Red Lion to the Marine Barracks. On the way there, we had to complete a plant scavenger hunt and locate and identify some of the plants found on Green Mountain.















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After our walk, we learned about the endemic and native ferns on the island and the work the conservation team is doing to protect these from extinction. We also learned that ferns reproduce using spores, not flowers like some other plants.









We then helped to repot some *Ophioglossum* (Adder's Tongue). First, we mixed some perlite with compost; then, we cleaned the old soil off the Adder's Tongue's roots and finally, we repotted the fern in a new pot with some our new compost and perlite mix.











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Our trip to Green Mountain was fantastic! We'd like to thank Lydia, Jolene and Diego for planning such an engaging day for us!
