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Hello from Year 1 & 2

1 & 2 have had a super busy half term. They have all settled back into school life and have adapted well to new routines and expectations. Here are a few snippets of their learning that they would like to share.

In literacy, last half term we explored the book 'Handa's Surprise'. Handa's Surprise is a story that is

set in Africa about a girl called Handa wanting to surprise her friend Akeyo. However it wasn't the surprise that she had hoped for. We read and sequenced the events of the story and created our own story maps.



We then moved on by comparing the story of Handa's surprise to the story Katie in London.

We looked at the differences and similarities between the two stories such as the setting of the stories.



In Science, our topic for the half term was Animals including Humans - People and their Pets. During these sessions we discussed the different kind of pets there are. We compared the different needs of these animals and the characteristics that make them good pets.

We also grouped different animals according to their characteristics including fish amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals.









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In art, we have been exploring paint and practicing our blending skills. The children really enjoyed experimenting with the different colours. The darker colours were used to represent a midnight scene and the brighter colours to create a sunset.
