Geography Field Trip

On Wednesday afternoon (during lesson) and on Thursday morning, students studying GCSE Geography had the opportunity to participate in some Human and Physical fieldwork around Two Boats, Georgetown and down at Pan Am beach. In Two Boats and Georgetown, students completed an Environmental Quality Survey, assessing the quality of housing, litter, traffic and green spaces. Students will analyse the information gathered to compare these two locations in upcoming lessons. At Pan Am beach, there is a waterfall and river that comes from the overflow from the desalination plant on the US Base. Here students measured the width, depth and velocity of the channel at 2 locations to compare how the river changes from the upper course to the lower course. Students will analyse the data to see if it answers the hypothesis they came up with in a previous lesson. 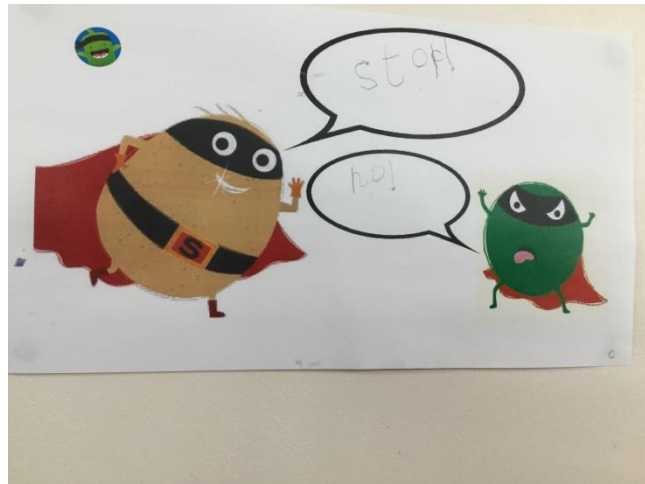
