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World Water Day 22nd March

Right now, we are seriously off- track to meet Sustainable Development Goal 6: water and sanitation for all by 2030. Billions of people and countless schools, businesses, healthcare centres, farms and factories don't have safe water and toilets they need. UNICEF/UNESCO

This World Water Day is about accelerating change to solve the water and sanitation crisis.

And because water affects us all, we need everyone to take action.

That means you!

Living on Ascension, water usage varies depending on who you work for and where you live but we can all make a difference by changing the way we use, consume and manage water in our lives
