Environmental study by year 9 We try to get out and about as much as possible



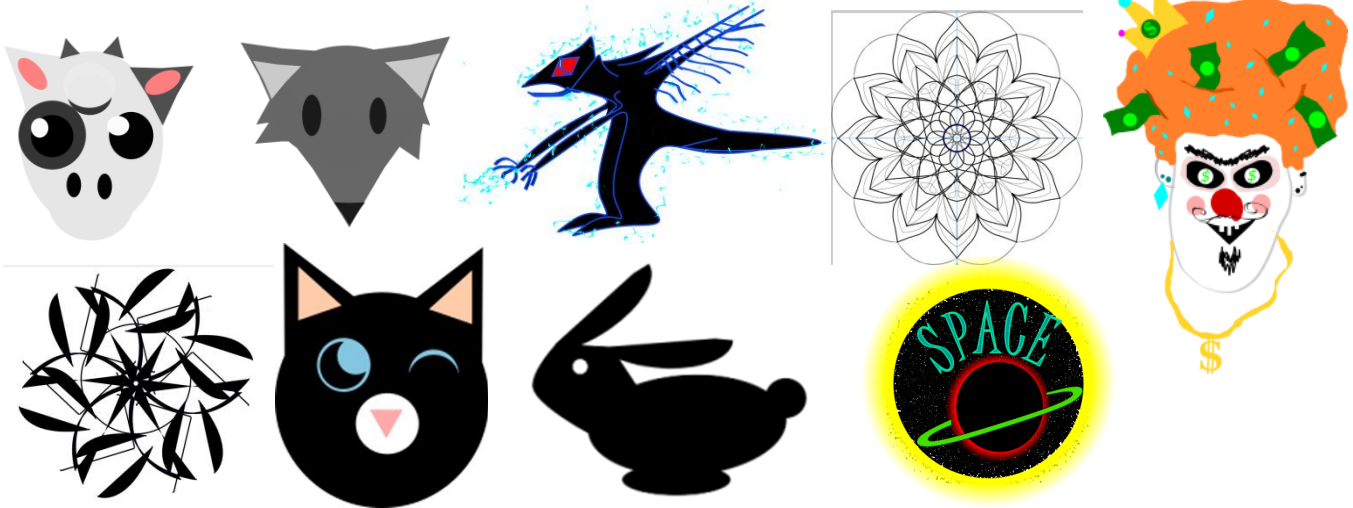
