Year 7 have been thinking about their top tips for the new Year 7 students in September:

It wasn't long ago we were in your shoes and starting secondary school. It may seem a bit scary at the times, but you will quickly get used to your new surroundings. Here are our seven top tips for year seven!

1- Be organised. Make sure to write down your homework in your planner- there is nothing worse than forgetting what to do or when it is due in. Pack your bag the night before with all your books, equipment and homework.

2- Don't be scared to ask older students for help. Don't hesitate to ask any teachers or students where to go or what to do. They've all been in the same position and know how you feel. They will help you get used to senior school in no time.
