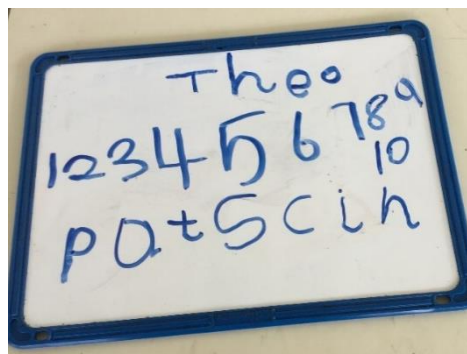
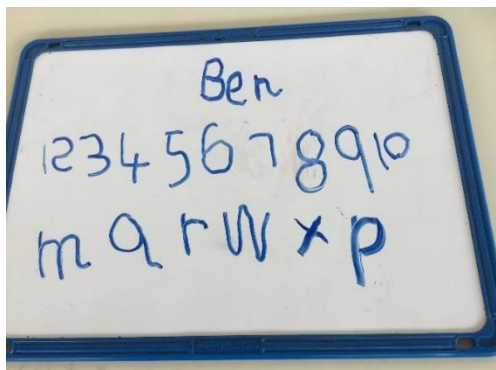
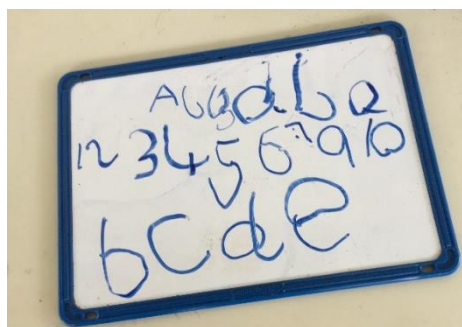
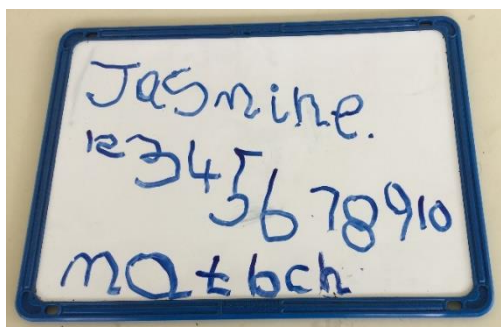


Hello from EYFS!

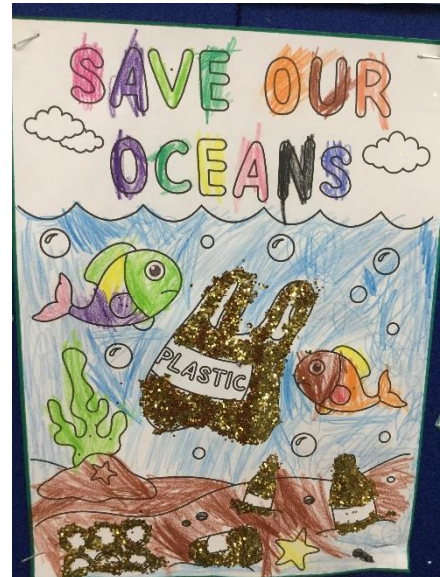

Now to shake hands with their friends! What has happened? The glitter germs have been transferred from one person to another. Look how fast germs can spread!

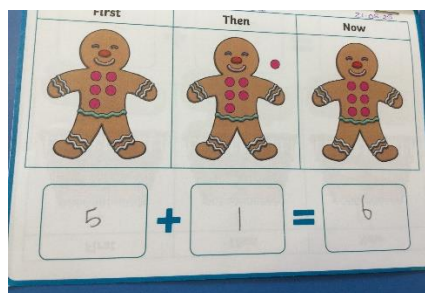
REMEMBER TO WASH YOUR HANDS!

During our Maths lessons, we have been busy learning all about addition.

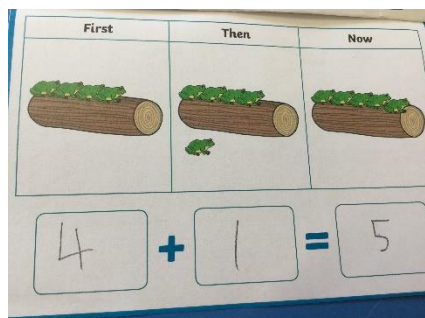
When teaching addition to EYFS we recommend using this

first, then, now structure with the children.

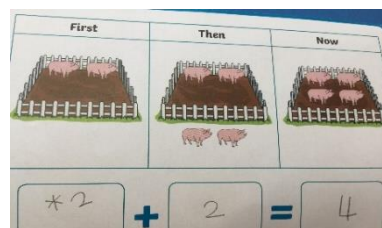
This structure allows children to tell mathematical stories and place these addition calculations into meaningful context.



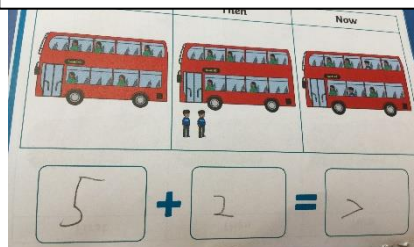
First, there are 5 buttons on the Gingerbread man.
